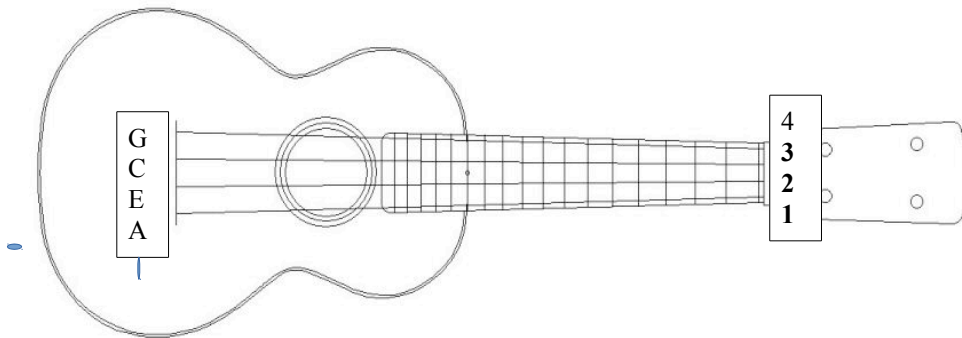
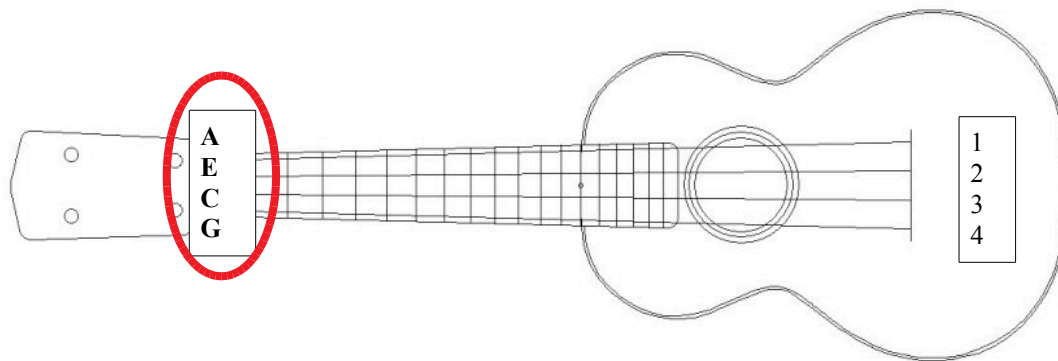


# TABS - Playing individual notes

The Ukulele has 4 strings:  
Numbered as follows:



**BUT, TAB is written as if the ukulele is upside down:**  
(The way it appears as YOU look down while you are playing)



From your normal playing position, tilt the front of the uke towards you so you can see the fretboard - the uke will now line up with the way TAB sheets are written:

An example of TAB: (*Mary Had a Little Lamb*)

Notice that in TAB:

- Each number is aligned to one of the 4 strings.
- Each number represents which fret to hold on that string.
- "0" means you play the string 'open'

Another example: *C Major Scale*:

Notes: C D E F G A B C
